WELCOME: We warmly welcome all to join us in worship of our God. If you are new to our parish community, please be sure to tell Fr. Pat that you will be joining our parish community. Contact the parish office if you have any questions. Visitor envelopes are available at all entrances.

MARRIAGE: Christian marriage is a sacred and serious commitment. Couples contemplating marriage should notify a parish priest at least nine months before the date on which they intend to marry. This should be done before any other arrangements are made so that a couple may be suitably served by the parish and diocese. All couples are required to take part in a Pre-Cana program or Engaged Encounter Weekend. **Sunday Weddings are not permitted.**

RCIA: The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is a community journey that leads to transformation of mind and spirit. Guided by the gospel and the examples of parish members, newcomers can find their place in the RCIA community of believers and discover their own relationship with Christ. The program runs from September through Pentecost with reception of the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil. Information is available at the parish office.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Knowing the Catholic faith and tradition is essential if faith and tradition are to continue to be nourishing facets of our lives. Religious formation is valuable for both youth and adults. Classes are conducted from September to May following the 9:00AM Mass on Sunday. Information on religious education programs for youth of all ages and educational opportunities for adults are available at the parish office.

BULLETIN: If you have information that you would like to place in the bulletin (community news, society/social news, etc.), please have it at the parish office no later than Tuesday morning.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Forty-five minutes before Saturday evening Mass or by appointment.

SHUT-INS: If someone you know is unable to attend Mass but would like to receive Communion or receive a copy of our weekly bulletin, please contact the parish office.

BAPTISMAL PREPARATION PROGRAM: All parents must attend a Baptismal Preparation meeting before this sacrament will be celebrated. Contact Father Pat at the parish office (570-836-3275) to schedule an appointment to discuss your child's baptism.

HOSPITAL VISITS: Visits are made on a regular basis.
PLEASE NOTE: The new privacy laws limit the amount of information that we receive from the hospitals or nursing/convalescent homes. It is necessary that family or friends notify us of these admittances.

HANDICAPPED SEATING AREA: Please note that the front pew nearest to the side door is reserved to accommodate those who have need due to disability. Please be kind enough to leave this pew available for that purpose.

PARKING LOT: [St. Mary's] Please keep the emergency lane in front of the church clear at all times. It is essential that vehicles are able to get in and out of the parking lot in case of an emergency. Please adhere to the parking spaces as delineated. Please be considerate of your fellow parishioners when you are backing up or turning to park or to exit the parking lot. There is ample parking on the upper level and supplemental parking on the side of the church.

FROM OUR GUEST COLUMNIST:

Hi Everyone!

My name is Maureen Bender and I, along with my husband Bill and our dear friends Ellen and Paul Wengen, were fortunate enough to travel to Spain and Portugal last month on Bishop Bambera's Pilgrimage. When Deacon Ray first mentioned being a guest writer for the bulletin, I kinda laughed at him but the more I thought about it, the more I wanted to try and capture a little bit of what we experienced and share it with all of you!

70 Pilgrims left Scranton...a few of us knew each other but most of us did not... on Monday, September 18th and arrived in Vigo, Spain late on Tuesday, September 19th. We visited amazing places. We visited The Basilica De Santa Maria De Vigo, Vigo Spain; Monastery Chapel Coimbra in Santiago de Compostella; Chapel of Apparitions, Fatima, Portugal; Igreja Do Sanissimo Milagre, Santarem; and Ingreia Paraquial De Sao Jose Church, Lisbon. We witnessed Pilgrims from all over the world finishing their Camino walks. We saw a giant Botafumiero flying through the air dispensing incense. We knelt before the bones of Saint James the Apostle, had Mass at the very sight where our Blessed Mother appeared to the 3 shepherd children in Fatima, visited the tomb of St. Anthony Padua and laid eyes on the actual "Bleeding Host". All these sights and experiences were truly amazing but I have to tell you, they were not the highlight of my Pilgrimage.

The highlights were so different than what I anticipated before I left. I realized that our Mass is universal. Whether you hear it in Spanish, French, Potuguese or Mandarin...we all know what's happening and we all respond in our native language. I witnessed numerous people helping the elderly and handicapped people in our group alone. I saw a woman with 2 canes struggle every day to get to our destinations with the most positive uplifting attitude I have ever witnessed. I met a woman bruised from head to toe from an unfortunate fall get up on the altar in front of everyone and do a reading. I saw the sadness in a woman who lost her husband much too early fade away as she broke bread with new-found friends. I listened to a deacon open his heart to us all as he spoke of the tragic death of his young daughter. There was a doctor from MN and a woman from CA who learned that they ironically both share a best friend in Scranton, PA. There were two 90-year-old women who have been best friends since 3rd grade making this journey together. I heard a foreign priest who spoke just enough English to hear my confession tell me that my penance was to "Live, Laugh and Love" every day!

These were the things that touched me the most. These were the things that made my Pilgrimage so

worthwhile! 70-some strangers finished their 10 day Pilgrimage as friends...very dear friends. Friends that bonded over spiritual gatherings and friends that bonded over delicious food and really good wine. And then it dawned on me...I didn't have to go on a Pilgrimage to help the elderly, to witness miracles, to break bread with friends or even to make new friends. These are things that are right here in front of us every day! We just have to open our eyes and see them! Our lives are our Pilgrimages and every single day, we have opportunities to "burst" open and share our faith with others!

Pennsylvania lawmakers have returned to Harrisburg to continue debating the 2017-18 state budget. While this remains an uncertain time, it is also an important time to show support for an expansion of the Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) program, which provides tuition assistance to many students in Diocesan Catholic Schools. It has been acclaimed as one of the best educational programs Pennsylvania offers to students in both public and private schools, and as it stands, the House has a chance to vote on an EITC increase.

PARISH MEMBERSHIP: All adult Catholics (age 18 and over) are expected to be officially registered in a Parish and participating at Mass and the other Sacraments on a regular basis. If you have graduated from College or High School and are now employed, you are expected to join on your own unless you are attending college or a trade school.

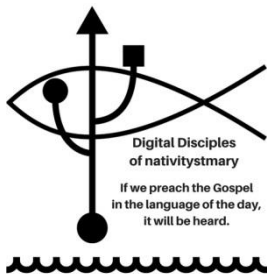
NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR:

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis or at 1-800-932-0313.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska, at 570-862-7551 or to Diocesan officials, including the Vicar General, Msgr. Thomas M. Muldowney, V.G., at 570-207-2269.

 - Explore the "Our Catholic Faith" section. Did you know that "digital learning" is one of the principal ways that adult Catholics now learn about and strengthen their faith? This section of the website contains such things as:
 - A listing of **common Catholic prayers.**
 - Curated links to many **Catholic websites.**
 - "**Catholic Link**". This is a blog with three blog posts that change weekly. Frequently included are several reflections on the readings from that week's Mass.
 - **Catholic Gift Shop.** Since The Guild Store in Scranton closed, it is very difficult to find Catholic

gifts for such things as Baptisms, First Communions, Confirmations, Weddings, Christmas, etc. This section contains links to seven of the most popular online Catholic gift stores for online ordering.

- Create a Facebook profile for yourself and "Like" our Facebook Page @nativitystmary. Did you know that "seniors" are the second largest population group of Facebook users next to young people? Creating a Facebook profile for yourself is easy to do and gives you access to a world of friends and information. Once you "Like" our page, you get access to timely posts of upcoming Parish events and other information. The posts usually include graphics and pictures. What is more, you can comment on or "like" individual posts, and share the posts with your Facebook friends. In this way, you are on your way to becoming a true "Digital Disciple".

IMPORTANT DIOCESAN INFORMATION

Reverend and Dear Father,

It has come to our attention that a phone scam could be using the names of our parishes. The scam goes something like this: A caller begins with "I am calling from XXXXXX Church ... Can you hear me?" If you respond by saying "Yes" they record it and use this to verify you saying "yes" to placing an order for a product or service. The scam could be sophisticated enough so that the phone number for the parish appears on caller ID.

You may want to make your parishioners aware of this and suggest they not answer any questions over the phone, even the seemingly innocent "Can you hear me?" or any similar "yes" or "no" question unless the caller identifies herself/himself as a recognized employee or representative of the parish. When in doubt call the parish to confirm whether any calls are in fact being made on behalf of the parish.

**EVENTS IN THE DIOCESE OF SCRANTON MARKING
THE 500TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE REFORMATION**

The Diocese of Scranton is encouraging all faithful to participate in upcoming events commemorating the 500th Anniversary of The Reformation in October as an opportunity to renew interest and re-energize prayer for Christian Unity.

A Catholic-Lutheran Ecumenical Study examining *Declaration on the Way*, a unique ecumenical text prepared by Lutheran and Catholic leaders, will be hosted by Lutheran Shared Ministry at St. Mark's Lutheran Church, 142 Market St, Williamsport, on Wednesday evenings, October 4th, 11th and 18th, from 7:00-8:30PM.

Developed specifically for October's 500th Reformation anniversary to promote further work toward the visible unity of all Christians, the document summarizes agreements between the two churches in the areas of Church, Ministry, and the Eucharist.

Each weekly session will focus on one of the three areas, with discussion co-facilitated by local Catholic and Lutheran clergy, including Father Brian Van Fossen, pastor of St. Joseph the Worker Parish in Williamsport.

An ecumenical prayer service will culminate the program series on Wednesday, October 25th at 7:00PM at St. Mark's.

A Common Prayer Service commemorating The Reformation's milestone anniversary will be hosted at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, 190 South Main St., Wilkes-Barre, on Thursday, October 26th at 7:00PM.

Presiding as host will be Pastor Peter Kuritz of Good Shepherd and St. John Lutheran Church and ecumenical officer for the local mission district of the Northeastern PA Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

Joining Pastor Kuritz as co-president for the prayer service will be Monsignor Vincent Grimalia, Diocesan Coordinator for Ecumenism and Interfaith Relations. This summer, the two clergymen led the prayer service for the 2017 Northeastern PA Synod Assembly of the ELCA, during which Bishop Joseph C. Bambera participated and addressed the Assembly.

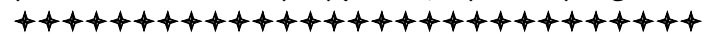
