WELCOME: We warmly welcome all to join us in worship of our God. If you are new to our parish community, please be sure to tell Fr. Pat that you will be joining our parish community. Contact the parish office if you have any questions. Visitor envelopes are available at all entrances.

MARRIAGE: Christian marriage is a sacred and serious commitment. Couples contemplating marriage should notify a parish priest at least nine months before the date on which they intend to marry. This should be done before any other arrangements are made so that a couple may be suitably served by the parish and diocese. All couples are required to take part in a Pre-Cana program or Engaged Encounter Weekend. **Sunday Weddings are not permitted.**

RCIA: The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is a community journey that leads to transformation of mind and spirit. Guided by the gospel and the examples of parish members, newcomers can find their place in the RCIA community of believers and discover their own relationship with Christ. The program runs from September through Pentecost with reception of the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil. Information is available at the parish office.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Knowing the Catholic faith and tradition is essential if faith and tradition are to continue to be nourishing facets of our lives. Religious formation is valuable for both youth and adults. Classes are conducted from September to May following the 9:00AM Mass on Sunday. Information on religious education programs for youth of all ages and educational opportunities for adults are available at the parish office.

BULLETIN: If you have information that you would like to place in the bulletin (community news, society/social news, etc.), please have it at the parish office no later than Tuesday morning.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Forty-five minutes before Saturday evening Mass or by appointment.

SHUT-INS: If someone you know is unable to attend Mass but would like to receive Communion or receive a copy of our weekly bulletin, please contact the parish office.

BAPTISMAL PREPARATION PROGRAM: All parents must attend a Baptismal Preparation meeting before this sacrament will be celebrated. Contact Father Pat at the parish office (570-836-3275) to schedule an appointment to discuss your child's baptism.

HOSPITAL VISITS: Visits are made on a regular basis.
PLEASE NOTE: The new privacy laws limit the amount of information that we receive from the hospitals or nursing/convalescent homes. It is necessary that family or friends notify us of these admittances.

HANDICAPPED SEATING AREA: Please note that the front pew nearest to the side door is reserved to accommodate those who have need due to disability. Please be kind enough to leave this pew available for that purpose.

PARKING LOT: [St. Mary's] Please keep the emergency lane in front of the church clear at all times. It is essential that vehicles are able to get in and out of the parking lot in case of an emergency. Please adhere to the parking spaces as delineated. Please be considerate of your fellow parishioners when you are backing up or turning to park or to exit the parking lot. There is ample parking on the upper level and supplemental parking on the side of the church.

FROM THE DEACON'S BENCH:

My Brothers and Sisters,

There's been a lot of talk lately about building fences to keep out all those we might call undesirable. Over in Israel, they have tried for quite a while now to keep out those who are deemed a threat to their people with only limited success. Donald Trump has promised that, if he is elected as our next President, he will have a fence built to keep out any illegal immigrants that might try to cross over the border from Mexico. It might be worth having him elected just to see how he gets out of that promise.



One such fence now under construction will have a gaping hole in it! The government of Austria is building a fence along its southern border with Hungary in an effort to prevent migrants from entering the country illegally. A stretch of the fence was to cross land owned by the Catholic Church, but the Bishop of that diocese has refused permission to build the fence on church property. In a letter sent by Bishop Zsifkovics to the Austrian government, he wrote that the planned barrier is inappropriate for a Diocese which "lived for decades in the shadow of the Iron Curtain." "I grew up with the iron curtain and I know what it meant for all of us when it fell," he said. The Bishop has also said repeatedly that new fences will not stop the refugee problem, only getting to the root of the problem will. "A fence would be contrary to the spirit of the Gospel and Pope Francis' clear message to Europe. So there will be an opening in the fence where it crosses on church land," he said.

People have been putting up fences with little success since time began. Some put up physical barriers and others use the verbal approach. When the angels of the Lord came to see Abraham and Sara in our first reading, everything went well until the Angel announces that at this time next year Sara will have a son. Being well beyond child bearing years, both put up a fence of unbelief to God's message. Martha tried to have a fence put up by complaining that her sister, Mary, is letting her do all the work and she wanted Jesus to chastise her. Being a carpenter, Jesus could have but refused and told Martha that her sister had chosen the better part.

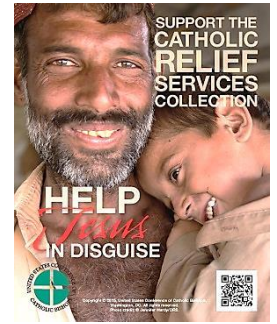
Throughout his ministry, Jesus continuously takes down the fences of hatred and misunderstanding and encourages his followers to do the same. May we use this week to take a good look at the fences we might have built to keep those whom we might not like out of our lives and look for ways to build bridges instead.

Pilgrimage Opportunity for High School Youth

High school youth groups from our Diocese have the unique opportunity to participate in a World Youth Day pilgrimage in nearby Lancaster.

The Diocese of Harrisburg is offering "World Youth Day - Stateside!" on **July 30-31**. Taking place at **Lancaster Catholic High School and Clipper Magazine Stadium in Lancaster**, this overnight, outdoor pilgrimage experience will mirror the events taking place at World Youth Day in Krakow, Poland.

WYD Stateside will correspond with the vigil and concluding Eucharistic celebration presided over by Pope Francis in Krakow. In Lancaster, pilgrims will be connected to those in Poland through prayer, fellowship, Mass, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, music and celebration to fully experience the spirit of World Youth Day.

The program will be headlined by emcee Jackie Francois Angel, a traveling speaker, singer/songwriter, and worship leader from Orange County, Calif. Special guests will include Ceili Rain, a pop-rock band with Celtic flavor and uplifting messages, and local Christian rock and worship musician Sean Patrick Malloy.

Bishop Edward Malesic of the Diocese of Greensburg - a native priest of the Diocese of Harrisburg - will celebrate the closing Mass at Clipper Magazine Stadium on Sunday at 2 p.m.

Plans are currently underway to share Pope Francis' World Youth Day message from Krakow to the pilgrims in Lancaster.

High school youth must register with a youth group for the stateside event. Young adults and families can register independent of a youth group. Registration is \$175 per person.

Two-day tickets include access to all of the weekend's events, four meal vouchers (two lunches, one breakfast and one dinner), and a pilgrim pack with a souvenir bottle, a vigil candle, prayer resources and a Rosary.

Sunday-only tickets include admission to the events at Clipper Magazine Stadium, a meal voucher for lunch, a pilgrim pack and souvenir bottle, and prayer resources.

NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE OF A

MINOR: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis or at 1-800-932-0313.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska, at 570-862-7551 or to Diocesan officials, including the Vicar General, Monsignor Thomas M. Muldowney, V.G., at 570-207-2269.

DRESSING APPROPRIATELY: Both of our parish churches are air conditioned. We need to be conscious of the way we dress for church. RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION: In order to worthily receive Jesus in Holy Communion, you must be a Catholic who is in the State of Grace (without serious or mortal sin). Those who are not married according to teaching of the Catholic Church as well as non-Catholics are unable to receive Holy Communion. We encourage those in an invalid marriage to seek an annulment and to have their civil marriage blessed (convalidated) in the Church so that it will become a Sacrament and you will receive the grace of matrimony. Contact Fr. Pat or Deacon Ray for information regarding the annulment process and the blessing of your civil marriage. If you are unable to receive Holy Communion, we encourage you to make a "spiritual communion" by reciting the following prayer:

An Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen!

HAVE YOU BEEN ASKED TO BE A SPONSOR? It is a wonderful honor to be asked to be a sponsor for Baptism and Confirmation. It signifies that you are being asked to live your life as an example and in imitation of God's love for the person you sponsor.

To serve as a sponsor, it is required that a person obtain a sponsor letter from his/her pastor. Sponsors must be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, Confirmation, (if married) be married according to the regulations for marriage as provided by the Roman Catholic Church, officially registered and participating weekly in the Sunday Eucharist & actively striving to live out your own baptismal commitment to Christ.

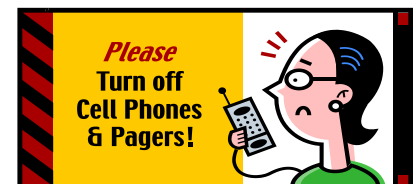
