WELCOME: We warmly welcome all to join us in worship of our God. If you are new to our parish community, please be sure to tell Fr. Pat that you will be joining our parish community. Contact the parish office if you have any questions. Visitor envelopes are available at all entrances.

MARRIAGE: Christian marriage is a sacred and serious commitment. Couples contemplating marriage should notify a parish priest at least nine months before the date on which they intend to marry. This should be done before any other arrangements are made so that a couple may be suitably served by the parish and diocese. All couples are required to take part in a Pre-Cana program or Engaged Encounter Weekend. **Sunday Weddings are not permitted.**

RCIA: The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is a community journey that leads to transformation of mind and spirit. Guided by the gospel and the examples of parish members, newcomers can find their place in the RCIA community of believers and discover their own relationship with Christ. The program runs from September through Pentecost with reception of the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil. Information is available at the parish office.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Knowing the Catholic faith and tradition is essential if faith and tradition are to continue to be nourishing facets of our lives. Religious formation is valuable for both youth and adults. Classes are conducted from September to May following the 9:00AM Mass on Sunday. Information on religious education programs for youth of all ages and educational opportunities for adults are available at the parish office.

BULLETIN: If you have information that you would like to place in the bulletin (community news, society/social news, etc.), please have it at the parish office no later than Tuesday morning.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Forty-five minutes before Saturday evening Mass or by appointment.

SHUT-INS: If someone you know is unable to attend Mass but would like to receive Communion or receive a copy of our weekly bulletin, please contact the parish office.

BAPTISMAL PREPARATION PROGRAM: All parents must attend a Baptismal Preparation meeting before this sacrament will be celebrated. Contact Father Pat at the parish office (570-836-3275) to schedule an appointment to discuss your child's baptism.

HOSPITAL VISITS: Visits are made on a regular basis.
PLEASE NOTE: The new privacy laws limit the amount of information that we receive from the hospitals or nursing/convalescent homes. It is necessary that family or friends notify us of these admittances.

HANDICAPPED SEATING AREA: Please note that the front pew nearest to the side door is reserved to accommodate those who have need due to disability. Please be kind enough to leave this pew available for that purpose.

PARKING LOT: [St. Mary's] Please keep the emergency lane in front of the church clear at all times. It is essential that vehicles are able to get in and out of the parking lot in case of an emergency. Please adhere to the parking spaces as delineated. Please be considerate of your fellow parishioners when you are backing up or turning to park or to exit the parking lot. There is ample parking on the upper level and supplemental parking on the side of the church.

FROM THE DEACON'S BENCH:

My Brothers and Sisters,



There are two things that I spend a lot of energy avoiding. The first is cooking - and that includes all three meals and any snacks that someone might want. Any time that I have forgotten this over the past 48 years that I've been married, everyone, including myself, has lived to regret it (losing my eyebrows while grilling was always a risk).

I wish I could say that I'm good at something when it comes to cooking but, alas, I'm not. My latest experiment with the frustrations of cooking was the year I tried to make scrambled eggs for my wife and me. I was doing ok until I added cinnamon, thinking that it would be like having both eggs and French toast at the same time. Unsurprisingly, it was the only time the dogs refused to eat anything from the table.

The second thing I try to avoid - and I mean really avoid - is planning day trips. I can remember the first time I violated this rule, thinking that maybe my wife was right when she suggested that any grown man can plan a short getaway. I was thinking, "what could possible go wrong?" Apparently, a lot. I made the decision to go to the Pennsylvania Grand Canyon in Wellsboro on a crisp, windy November morning. I had the day all set. We would walk the trails and spend the day enjoying nature. Somehow my wife agreed. As soon as she agreed, the house seemed to shudder, but I just thought it was the wind and ignored this sign of impending doom. I really should have listened. Instead, we optimistically embarked on the trip.

We arrived after a not-so-pleasant drive (who knew that all the restaurants were closed on Mondays?) to find out that no one in their right mind goes to the canyon in November. It was in the low 20s and snowing. Not a friendly fluffy snow either. More like a "you should have really listened to the house shuddering" kind of snow.

The only saving grace of the trip was encountering young newlyweds who proved that I wasn't the only one plagued by poor trip planning skills. The bride was telling her new husband that it was obvious that he didn't love her. My wife, being much more experienced, wasn't wasting time yelling at me. She was already back in the car.

I wish I could say I'd learned my lesson. However, on July 13th, I decided that it was worth taking another stab at planning a day trip, so I invited the whole family - those who were interested - to Watkins Glen, NY for a nice walk in the summer sun on the many trails.

Early Thursday morning, we left to warm sun and clear skies. I started to get a little uneasy when, just after we entered New York, it started to drizzle, then steadily rain. The road then disappeared in the fog. I optimistically (stubbornly?) pressed on. When we arrived, it had progressed into torrential downpours, the temp had dropped 10 degrees and the wind was gusting off of Seneca Lake so hard that seagulls were going backwards. I thought I might be in trouble.

What saved the day was my great family, who tried hard to keep smiles on their faces. We tend to make jokes out of our bad experiences, and this day was no different. We decided to eat and then walk out onto the pier which was partially sheltered. I hadn't brought a coat - or a parka - and used my knowledge from previous errors and made a run for the car. I left my family in the dust without looking back.

Thankfully, my wife, who apparently knew something like this might happen, suggested going to the nearby Corning Museum of Glass until the weather improved and then go to hike in Mt. Pisgah State Park on the way home. As always, she saved the day. I don't think I will ever plan a trip again.

I'm glad that Elijah the prophet knew how to plan a trip or at least ask for directions...(I also once captained a 6 hour trip to Dorney Park when our kids were little. All seven of us stuck in the car. No one was happy that day but my kids never fail to tease me about it now!) Elijah got to experience the wonders of nature - fire, earthquake and hurricane force winds. But in the end, Elijah also got a glimpse of God. (I wonder what travel agent he used.)

Paul managed to go from Jerusalem to Rome without too much trouble. When Jesus sent His 12 Disciples out to sea in terrifying wind and rain (sounds like one of my trips), He was able to save the trip by calming not only the sea but also them.

I guess the moral of this letter is: if we trust in God, our journey will always go right in the end. Unless, of course, I am left to plan it alone.

If you have a need for training for the Light of Christ and Parvuli Dei Emblems, please let me know and we will make arrangements to help you complete that training.


At the end of Thursday evening, you will have completed the requirements for a certificate as a counselor for:

 - View the current lector, usher, greeter, and Eucharistic Minister schedules online. Just go to the Ministries of the Mass page for your parish and look under your ministry.
 - Look up information from the current bulletin or old bulletins.
 - Explore the "Our Catholic Faith" section. Did you know that "digital learning" is one of the principal ways that adult Catholics now learn about and strengthen their faith? This section of the website contains such things as:
 - A listing of **common Catholic prayers.**
 - Curated links to many **Catholic websites.**
 - "**Catholic Link**". This is a blog with three blog posts that change weekly. Frequently included are several reflections on the readings from that week's Mass.

• **Catholic Gift Shop.** Since The Guild Store in Scranton closed, it is very difficult to find Catholic gifts for such things as Baptisms, First Communions, Confirmations, Weddings, Christmas, etc. This section contains links to seven of the most popular online Catholic gift stores for online ordering.

• Create a Facebook profile for yourself and "Like" our Facebook Page @nativitystmary. Did you know that "seniors" are the second largest population group of Facebook users next to young people? Creating a Facebook profile for yourself is easy to do and gives you access to a world of friends and information. Once you "Like" our page, you get access to timely posts of upcoming Parish events and other information. The posts usually include graphics and pictures. What is more, you can comment on or "like" individual posts, and share the posts with your Facebook friends. In this way, you are on your way to becoming a true "Digital Disciple".



Bishop Joseph C. Bambera invites the faithful to join him on a special pilgrimage to Spain and Portugal in honor of the 100th anniversary of Our Lady of Fatima's appearance to three young shepherd children in 1917. **The pilgrimage will take place September 18-26, 2017 and will include Masses celebrated by the Bishop and visits to many sacred and historic sites, including nearly two days in Fatima where the Marian apparitions occurred.**



The Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God, appeared six times to the children – Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta – near the town of Fatima, Portugal between May 13 and October 13, 1917. During a time of war and turmoil, she told them that she had been sent by God with a message that Heaven would grant peace to all the world if her requests for prayer, reparation and consecration were heard and obeyed. The apparitions culminated in an inexplicable spectacle on October 13, when 70,000 onlookers witnessed the sun spinning like a ball in the sky. **Space is limited, so it is recommended that you call as soon as possible for reservations.** All arrangements and reservations are to be made through TRAVELWORLD. NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR: It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis or at 1-800-932-0313.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska, at 570-862-7551 or to Diocesan officials, including the Vicar General, Msgr. Thomas M. Muldowney, V.G., at 570-207-2269.
