**WELCOME:** We warmly welcome all to join us in worship of our God. If you are new to our parish community, please be sure to tell Fr. Pat that you will be joining our parish community. Contact the parish office if you have any questions. Visitor envelopes are available at all entrances.

**MARRIAGE:** Christian marriage is a sacred and serious commitment. Couples contemplating marriage should notify a parish priest at least nine months before the date on which they intend to marry. This should be done before any other arrangements are made so that a couple may be suitably served by the parish and diocese. All couples are required to take part in a Pre-Cana program or Engaged Encounter Weekend. **Sunday Weddings are not permitted.**

**RCIA:** The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults is a community journey that leads to transformation of mind and spirit. Guided by the gospel and the examples of parish members, newcomers can find their place in the RCIA community of believers and discover their own relationship with Christ. The program runs from September through Pentecost with reception of the Sacraments at the Easter Vigil. Information is available at the parish office.

**RELIGIOUS EDUCATION:** Knowing the Catholic faith and tradition is essential if faith and tradition are to continue to be nourishing facets of our lives. Religious formation is valuable for both youth and adults. Classes are conducted from September to May following the 9:00AM Mass on Sunday. Information on religious education programs for youth of all ages and educational opportunities for adults are available at the parish office.

**BULLETIN:** If you have information that you would like to place in the bulletin (community news, society/social news, etc.), please have it at the parish office no later than Tuesday morning.

**SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION:** Forty-five minutes before Saturday evening Mass or by appointment.

**SHUT-INS:** If someone you know is unable to attend Mass but would like to receive Communion or receive a copy of our weekly bulletin, please contact the parish office.

**BAPTISMAL PREPARATION PROGRAM:** All parents must attend a Baptismal Preparation meeting before this sacrament will be celebrated. Contact Father Pat at the parish office (570-836-3275) to schedule an appointment to discuss your child's baptism.

**HOSPITAL VISITS:** Visits are made on a regular basis.  
**PLEASE NOTE:** The new privacy laws limit the amount of information that we receive from the hospitals or nursing/convalescent homes. It is necessary that family or friends notify us of these admittances.

**HANDICAPPED SEATING AREA:** Please note that the front pew nearest to the side door is reserved to accommodate those who have need due to disability. Please be kind enough to leave this pew available for that purpose.

**PARKING LOT:** [St. Mary's] Please keep the emergency lane in front of the church clear at all times. It is essential that vehicles are able to get in and out of the parking lot in case of an emergency. Please adhere to the parking spaces as delineated. ## FROM OUR GUEST COLUMNIST:

### Adoration

To write about Adoration is to write about the Eucharist, the body and blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ, so it all begins with Mass. Beginning with the sign of the cross, offering peace, the reading of the Scriptures, hearing the homily, the Profession of Faith, our petitions, and especially the Eucharistic prayer, reignites my faith. The words are reassuring, calming, comforting, and strengthening and they increase my confidence in Christ. Every time. And then there's the consecration, followed by the ringing of bells to let us know what just took place. The culmination is when Father holds up the Eucharist and says, "Behold the Lamb of God. Behold Him who takes away the sins of the world. Happy are those who are called to the supper of the Lamb." And we respond, "Lord, I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." In this moment, we all participate in a brief Adoration.

By now, you have seen previous inserts in our Sunday bulletin for the Eucharistic Adoration at Nativity B.V.M. every Wednesday, 3:00-7:00PM, ending with Benediction. Thank you Cindy Brown, Gloria Pasternak and Father Pat for making this happen. Our first four-hour Adoration was Wednesday, November 1<sup>st</sup>, and we had a good turnout – 26 people. There is a book to sign in and pamphlets available in the back of the church to learn more about this Catholic tradition. If your schedule allows, please come and join us for whatever amount of time works best for you. Personally, I find it to be a good time to pray the Rosary and Chaplet of Divine Mercy.

There is something to be said about removing ourselves from our routine surroundings and spending precious one-on-one time with Jesus. This simple act can clear our heads from the clutter and distractions that can potentially place distance between us and God. Of course, it is true that our prayers can be heard by God from anywhere, but there's so much more going on during Adoration of the Eucharist, things so vast and great, it goes beyond us and our little corner of the world..

I went home from Adoration this week wanting to learn more about it. Like anything else, there's plenty of information available online – the history, the effects, and the writings of the Saints. My favorite find is "Over 100 Benefits of Eucharistic Adoration." Here are a few of the quotes:

"The spiritual lives of our families are strengthened through our Holy Hour." (Pope John Paul II)

"A Holy Hour of Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament is so important to Jesus that multitude of souls go to Heaven who would have otherwise gone to hell." (Jesus' revelation to Blessed Dina Belanger)

"All angels of heaven gaze in ecstasy at the image

left upon your soul after each hour of Holy Hour you make in the presence of Jesus in the Holy Sacrament." (Letters to a Brother Priest)

"In order to convert America and save the world what we need is for every parish to come before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in Holy Hours of prayer." (Saint Mother Theresa)

"I have a burning thirst to be honored by men in the Blessed Sacrament." (Jesus speaking to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque)

"A Holy Hour before the Most Blessed Sacrament so pleases the heart of Jesus, that every man, woman and child on earth receives a new effect of God's graces." (Saint Faustina)

I've been following a story with the fifth grade CCD classes about Ciudad Juarez, Mexico. It is believed that Eucharistic Adoration had an effect in reducing the number of killings from almost 2,800 in 2010 to less than 300 in 2015. This report came from Father Patricio Hileman, who has been diligent in setting up adoration chapels all over Latin America. These foundings have shown Fr. Hileman that "when a parish adores God day and night, the city is transformed."

Haven't you had enough of all the nonsense that is going on around us, in our town, in our country and around the world? Like everybody else, I am sickened by the constant shootings. I am disheartened to see my youngest son and his friends going to viewings for other young people who are dying unnecessarily. I am convinced we can do something about this and all things through Adoration, and that it is time well spent. We all have something or someone to pray for. Worrying and stressing doesn't get us anywhere, and goes against our beliefs as Catholics anyway. Instead, I hope you are inspired to join us to fight with the good fight of faith.

**NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR:** It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) electronically at [www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis](http://www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis) or at 1-800-932-0313.

It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska, at 570-862-7551 or to Diocesan officials, including the Vicar General, Msgr. Thomas M. Muldowney, V.G., at 570-207-2269.

## VETERANS DAY



**Veterans Day** is an official **United States public holiday**, observed annually on November 11<sup>th</sup> that honors **military veterans**; that is, persons who served in the **United States Armed Forces**. It coincides with other holidays including Armistice Day and Remembrance

Day celebrated in other countries that mark the anniversary of the end of **World War I**; major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11<sup>th</sup> hour of the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month of 1918, when the **Armistice with Germany** went into effect. The United States previously observed Armistice Day. The U.S. holiday was renamed Veterans Day in 1954. Veterans Day is not to be confused with **Memorial Day**, a U.S. public holiday in May; **Veterans Day celebrates the service of all U.S. military veterans, while Memorial Day honors those who died while in military service.** It is also not to be confused with **Armed Forces Day**, a minor U.S. remembrance that also occurs in May, which specifically honors those *currently serving* in the U.S. military.
